- Medical Billing and Coding starting September 17, 2026
 - Phlebotomy Technician starting September 21, 2026
 - Clinical Medical Assistant starting October 13, 2026
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Financial Assistance Details

- Up to **\$1,000** in tuition assistance per program
 - **NHA licensure exam fee covered** for students who remain program compliant.
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Student Requirements for Program Consideration

- Applicants must provide a Texas address at the time of application
- Possess High School Diploma or Equivalency Certificate
- Do not have a college degree or training certification.
- Make the required down payment with the Community Education Center
- Schedule Interview with AEL
- Complete Application and Interview Process
- Submit Online Enrollment Forms/ID
- Take the Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE) Assessment
- Complete Contract
- Attend Orientation Session

Student Requirements for Program Completion

- Attend the Basic Skills class weekly throughout the 12–16 weeks of the Allied Health program and continue until the certification exam has been taken.
- **Mandatory Adult Education Class:**
 - **Mondays, 3:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m.**
 - Non-flexible schedule: attendance required to maintain scholarship eligibility.
- Complete Online Modules for program
- Take Final TABE Assessment and show progress.
- Complete certification process and prepare for certification exam.
- Submit certificates to Adult Education

Student Benefits

- Financial assistance for Allied Health tuition and fees
(Partial tuition and fees paid by AEL; remaining balance placed on an online payment plan – debit/credit card required)
 - Free academic support for Allied Health course
 - Testing and study skills assistance
 - Guidance on certification process and exam preparation
